

## NUA Tuition Fee Status Assessment Process

Your tuition fee status will be officially assessed through the NUA Admissions Portal from February 2020 if you have firmly accepted a conditional or unconditional offer from NUA. Through the portal you will be asked a number of questions about your nationality and residence which will enable us to assess your fee status.

There are two fee statuses - Home and Overseas. The 2020/21 fee rates for each status are as follows:

Fee status	Course	Fee
Home	Undergraduate degree (full-time)	£9,250
Overseas	Undergraduate degree (full-time)	£14,500

Your fee status depends on whether you meet certain criteria, provided in regulations and guidance published by the English government. You can view this guidance by looking under 'Higher Education' on the [UKCISA website](#).

If you are a British citizen who will be living in the UK on the 1<sup>st</sup> September 2020, **and** you have lived in the UK for 3 years before the 1<sup>st</sup> September 2020, it is likely you will be assessed as Home fee status.

If you are an EU national and you have resided in the EEA/Switzerland/Overseas territories for 3 years before the 1<sup>st</sup> September 2020, it is likely you will be assessed as Home fee status.

There are additional Home categories in the UKCISA guidance referenced above but if you don't fit into any of these categories you will be assessed as Overseas fee status.
